*Noted Composer David Haas Performs at Notre Dame Prep—
Concert part of school's 50th anniversary of Towson campus*

August 1, 2010 (Towson, MD)— As a kickoff to Notre Dame Preparatory School's "50 Years on Hampton Lane" Anniversary Year Celebration, world-renowned Catholic composer David Haas, will perform Tuesday, September 14, 2010, at 7:30 p.m. The concert will take place in the school auditorium, and tickets can be purchased online (www.notredameprep.com) in advance of the show or at the door. Prices are \$15 for adults, \$10 for students.

For decades, Haas' extensive cannon of contemporary religious music has inspired liturgical musicians and non-musicians for its depth, accessibility, and beauty. Highly regarded as one of the preeminent liturgical music composers in the English-speaking world, he has produced more than 45 collections of original music. His liturgical works are sung and prayed throughout the world and appear in hymnals of many Christian denominations and in many languages.

Haas resides in Eagan, Minnesota, where he is director of The Emmaus Center for Music, Prayer and Ministry. He serves as campus minister/artist-in-residence at Benilde-St. Margaret's High School in St. Louis Park, Minnesota, where he teaches in the theology and music departments.

Founded in 1873, Notre Dame Preparatory School is a Catholic, independent, college preparatory school for 760 girls in grades 6-12. Owned and operated by the School Sisters of Notre Dame, the school relocated to its current 60-acre Towson campus in September 1960. For the 2010-2011 school year, numerous events will be held to celebrate NDP's three-part mission of excellence, spiritual growth and the practice of social justice.
